DIVISION MEMORANDUM

IMPLEMENTATION OF SCHOOL-BASED FEEDING PROGRAM (SBFP) FOR SY 2019-20

To: Public Schools District Supervisor
 Elementary School Heads
 SGOD-School Health Personnel

1. Pursuant to DepEd Memorandum No. 15, s 2018, Supplemental Guidelines on the Implementation of School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP), The Department of Education (DepEd), through the Bureau of Learners Support Services-School Health Division (BLSS-SHD), shall implement the School-Based Feeding Program (SBFP) for School Years (SY) 2017-2022 to address undernutrition among public school children.
2. The SBFP covers all Severely Wasted (SW) and Wasted (W) Kindergarten to Grade 6 pupils for SY 2019-2020. The program primarily aims to improve the nutritional status of the beneficiaries by at least 70% at the end of 120 feeding days. Secondly, it aims to increase classroom attendance by 85% to 100% and improve the children's health and nutrition values and behavior.
3. All schools are advised to conduct early weighing of all learners (Kinder-Grade 6) and submit reports on the number of actual beneficiaries for current SY using SBFP Forms 1-3 including Consolidated District Baseline Nutritional Status Report for SY 2019-20 using the BMI Template and Work & Financial Plan for the said program to Schools Division Office through SGOD-School Health Section not later than June 28, 2019. Feeding shall commence as soon as preparatory activities are conducted and funds are received by schools.
4. In line with this, conduct of nutritional assessment (Height and Weight Taking) should be done by all school nurses together with the teachers/classroom advisers during the whole month of June and all actual beneficiaries must be dewormed before the start of the feeding.
5. Immediate dissemination and compliance to this memorandum is desired.
