**PARTICIPATION TO THE 2021-2022 REGIONAL DIRECTOR'S AWARD FOR EXCELLENCE IN CURRICULUM AND INSTRUCTION**

TO: All School Heads  
 Elementary and Secondary Schools

1. Pursuant to DM No. 066 s. 2021 and the RM No. 191.s. 2022, and through the Curriculum Implementation Division, this office will accept nominations from each of the ten districts to select the division entry for the Regional Director's Award for Excellence in Curriculum and Instruction until August 8, 2022.
2. This activity is anchored on the Civil Service Commission's (CSC) Program on Awards and Incentives for Service (PRAISE) and Implementing Guidelines on the Revised School-Based Management (SBM) Framework, Assessment and Tool (APAT)
3. This activity aims to recognize and reward the exemplary contribution of the schools, and the Schools Division Offices in making authentic learning happen in the lives of the public school learners. Moreover, this will appreciate the initiatives and innovations exerted by various schools and the division office in managing the delivery and instruction amidst the pandemic. Hence, in accordance, all schools and SDOs with advanced focus on learning under the SAFE CI and RDAFE CI shall be recognized. This is still in compliance of the offices' initiatives to the guidelines and principles stated in the BE-LCP (DO. No. 12 s. 2020) shall be observed and considered.
4. The award categories are as follows: Each of the ten districts shall submit an entry for each category and from the winners will be the division entry for the regional level search.
