

- Deped Order No. 16, s. 2017, otherwise known as the Research Management Guidelines (RMG) stipulates that the Department of Education continues to promote and strengthen the culture of research in basic education. In this regard, The Schools Division of Abra through its division research management, E-Takwat ken Sukisok guides in managing research initiatives at the school, division, and regional levels.
- 2. This activity aims to:
 - a. strengthen the culture of research in the Schools division of Abra
 - come up with innovations, intervention strategies, and processes to address issues and gaps and improve the performance of the teachinglearning process
- The year round timeline for the submission, evaluation and retrieval of researches are as follows:

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- Proposals and final reports should be pre- assessed by the School Head and/ or the School Research Committee before endorsing to the Division Office using the evaluation checklist.
- 5. All research proposals should adhere to the guidelines stipulated in the E-Takwat ken Sukisok Research Management guidelines (enclosure No. 1). In addition, research should be aligned to the MATATAG agenda of DepEd (enclosure No. 2) and the gaps/ issues that needs to be addressed in the teaching and learning process.
- 6. Researchers must ensure the completeness of the proposal as well as the attachments. No actions shall be given to incomplete research proposals. Downloadable forms and templates can be accessed from the E-Takwat ken Sukisok FB page google link. The following should be in the proposal:
 - a. Title Page following the proper template
 - b. Research application form
 - c. Declaration of Anti-plagiarism
 - d. Declaration of absence of conflict of interest
 - e. AR/BR
 - f. Letter, Sample Activity, Research Tool
 - g. Accomplished Evaluation Checklist by the School Research Committee
- Research Proposals will be assessed and evaluated by the members of the SDRC. Only APPROVED proposals shall be implemented.
- 8. Teaching and non-teaching personnel are encouraged to conduct research and undergo research orientations. The Planning and Research section provides technical assistance in the conduct of action and basic research through school/ district orientations, virtual orientation, through the E-Takwat ken Sukisok FB page, and the Takwat 12 O'clock Research.

From International to Local Identified the issue/ gap that leads to the conduct of the study Literature to support claims or statements provided in the rationale. At least 1 or 2 or more Aims, objectives, subjects and those who will benefit from the study are included.
11	Action Research Questions	With research general aim to be followed by the questions Alignment of the research questions to the research gap Descriptive but correlate to give more meaningful result of the study The integration of the intervention/innovation/strategy before and after will be taken as one question. Example: (for quasi- experimental study) What is the level of reading comprehension of the learners in the control and experimental groups in their pretest and post- test? Significant difference in the control and experimental Significant difference between the control and experimental Provide the Null Hypothesis. There is no Add qualitative questions (level up for those who already conducted researches twice or thrice) Note: be specific with the design of authors. Utilize that of Creswell.

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	 Part I will be the description of the intervention/innovatin/strategy. Cite the author if adapted and supported by a theory. Presents what is new and modified. How will it address the problem? Part 2 will be the step by step process. Includes the part of the learners, parents, timeframe. It can be implemented during class hours or after class hours. It depends on the study. Discuss the implementation of the intervention, procedure, activities, time frame. Presents the role of the researchr/s, learners, parents, etc). Provide sample in this part but the whole innovation should be placed in the appendices.

II. Literature Review	alingment to the literature review Theoretical or conceptual framework based on the research questions should end with the conceptual framework in a narrative form. A summary of the literature. At least paragraph can be used to corroborate and contradict the results of the study.
III. Research Questions	Addresses issues and challenges that are interesting, novel, and current to the group being studied. Clarity Concise Consistent Measurable within the specific timeframe Complex
IV. Scope and Limitation	Cover in terms of data collection, data analysis, discussion



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	Limitation can ONLY be the methodology data interpretation, scope of the study (any of these). Example Limited to BE coord then explain if purposive.
IV Research Methodology	Describes the chosen research design and resulting research processes in a manner that is understandable to other teachers planning similar interventions and researchers conducting similar work. Appropriateness to answer the research questions.
a. Sampling	Who are the population/participant? Why choose these population samples? How many? How did you select them? (sampling technique)
b. Data Collections	What tool did you used Process/Procedure Validation and Reliability Test of instruments Briefly describe your methods supported by references to research applying the methods in similar situations
c. Plan for Data Analysis.	 describe data analysis technique supported by references to research applying analysis in similar situations
d Ethical Issues	Circumstances by which the respondent's/ samples participation will compromise their rights for privacy and confidentiality *-do you need to get informed consent names, label your subjects?
V. Timetable or Gantt Chart	 Indicate the major milestones with specific activities of your proposed research At least 6 months form conceptualization to dissemination
VI Cost Estimates	Write a detailed breakdown of expense items with their corresponding costs. The items and costs should reasonably reflect the funding needs of the Action Research.



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VII. Plans for Dissemination and Advocacy	 Indicate how will you disseminate the results of your study for a wider education community and for specific group of people, teachers, students, parents or other stakeholders that may benefit from your finding The key here is to make your results and findings accessible for key stakeholders.
