2019 TALGED ESKWELA Search

- Schools Division of Abra is conducting the 2019 TALGED (Tarigagay dagiti Abrenio, Linak kontra Gubat ken Epekto ti Didigra)
 Eskwela Search for elementary and secondary level. The Search aims to inculcate a culture of safety in the day-to-day
 experience of children in school, increases the participation of the school in addressing potential disasters by reducing
 vulnerabilities and raise the awareness, preparedness and capacities of schools to prepare and manage possible disasters or
 emergencies.
- 2. Districts are invited to submit one entry for the elementary and all secondary schools are qualified to participate in the search.
- Complete documents should be submitted to the Schools Division Office on or Before October 4, 2019.
- 4. TALGED Eskwela Guidance Note is listed in the enclosed attachment.
- 5. Desk evaluation of the documents and validation shall be conducted by **SDO TALGED ESKWELA SEARCH Committee**.
- One Elementary and one secondary school shall be declared as the Elementary Best Talged Eskwela Search Winner for 2019
 and Secondary Best Talged Eskwela Search Winner, respectively. Non-winners are all considered finalist.
- 7. Winner from elementary and secondary will automatically represent the Schools Division Office of Abra for the Regional Search for Safest School and Gawad KALASAG.
- 8. Plaques of Recognition indicating recipient as Best TALGED ESKWELA 2019 shall be awarded to the winners while Certificate of Recognition indicating the recipient as a finalist shall be awarded the participating schools. Certificate of Recognition shall be given to the Principals as Best School Head DRRM Implementer, SDRRM Coordinator as Best SDRRM Implementer, SDRRM Coordinator as Best SDRRM Implementer, Best SDRRM Team Implementer and the Public Schools District Supervisor will be given a recognition of the winning district.

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TALGED Eskwela Search Style Guide

- All entries must contain an accurate and comprehensive table of contents; all pages must also contain
 a page number. Each criterion shall have a corresponding tabbing.
- Attachment of pictures: All pictures must be in colored format; At least two (2) photo attachments
 are required for each page when supplemented with text description or a maximum of three (3)
 photos provided with text description. HD photos are required in order not to compromise its quality
 when expanded or otherwise
- 3. Scanned documents are attachment: Unless of utmost importance or relevance, such documents shall not be allowed to occupy the entire page. It is recommended that there are at least two (2) scanned copy of documents per page.
- 4. All of the entries shall be compiled or presented in one single document (or book)
- 5. Introduction shall be limited to the following:
 - -Brief description or profile of the School
 - Brief message and acknowledgments
 - Executive Summary
- Use of standardized font, font size, paper size, paper orientation, line, spacing, indents, and number of pages

- 7. The entry shall be hardbound (solid/laminated format), unless there is an unavailability of hard binding in the area.
- 8. The cover page must GREEN
- 9. The presentation of compliance in different categories shall be clear, concise and straight to the point; it is highly encouraged to avoid unnecessary inclusions in the presentation.

ANNEXES shall be limited to the following:

- Means of verification
- Relevant photos
- Clearances/Titles
- Minutes of the meeting
- MOA/ U
- Any relevant/primary documents that will prove a certain claim
- 10. Maximum number of pages: Standard in all categories, the maximum number of page per entries shall be 300. Including the introduction and annexes. Deliberate non-compliance shall constitute disqualification from the SEARCH.
